2 sheet Arches bright white or natural white

watercolor 300# paper: 22"x 30"- cold

2 sheet Fabriano 300# watercolor paper:

2 sheet Indigo Handmade Artpapers 640gsm/300 lb, 22" × 30"\*

18" x 24" x 3/4" drawing board

3/4" masking tape (NO colored tape)

2B pencil or an ebony pencil

Kneaded eraser

X-Acto knife

Paper towels

Small water spray bottle

Sponge

Water container

Old toothbrush

OPTIONAL: Tabletop easel\*\*\*
